

<u>Course Description:</u> In the Humanities course students will learn about the major events, social structures, culture, economy, and politics of selected countries around the world. In studying these concepts students will develop essential English Language and 21st century technology skills. This year we will examine Nigeria, Brazil, Haiti, El Salvador, and Cambodia.

Course Expectations: Humanities students will be expected to

- Be Prepared:

<u>Classroom Policies:</u> Humanities students are expected to observe the policies described on the following chart.

SUBJECT	CLASSROOM POLICY		
ELECTRONIC DEVICES	Cell phones, or any other electronic devices are <u>only permitted before school</u> , at <u>lunch or after school</u> . If they are used at any other time they will be confiscated and returned during lunch or afterschool.		
TARDINESS	Doors are locked 5 minutes after the late bell. If students arrive after the door is locked, they must report to the 9 th grade office. No student will be admitted to class without a tardy slip.		
LATE WORK	Late work will not be accepted without a PROVEN ABSENCE form signed by the main office. There are no exceptions to this policy.		
PARENT CONTACT	All students will be contacted throughout the school year. Parents will be contacted any time a student is sent out of class for disciplinary reasons or if the student is failing class.		
SUPPLIES	Unprepared students will be able to obtain supplies if they provide collateral (\$1, Student ID, etc), or if they pay for the items using Tiger Tickets.		
SEATING	All seating is assigned and permanent unless changed by the teacher. A student can request a seat change but cannot do so without teacher consent.		
BATHROOM PASSES	Bathroom passes will only be issued TWO TIMES per student, per marking period. Students can only be excused to the bathroom after the first 10 minutes of class, and will not be excused when less than 10 minutes remain in class.
